



**CREATE AWARENESS IN YOUR COMMUNITY WITH THE

“LET’S TALK ABOUT SEX IN THE AGE OF HIV/AIDS”
WORKSHOP**

Pulling content from the bestselling anthology *Not in My Family: AIDS in the African American Community*, the session introduces college students with the capacity training for developing a plan for managing and reducing the rate of HIV/AIDS infections.

Points covered during this session will address the various roles the media can play in this crisis that includes, but is not limited to the following content:

- Effective strategies for the health care community in reaching African American community.
- Introduction of engaging methods for couples to dialogue about sex and sexuality.
- Introduction of engaging methods for parents to conduct safe sex dialogue with children
- Understanding the role of “denial” in dealing with HIV/AIDS
- Methods for including the clergy into the HIV/AIDS conversation.

Key points covered during the program will specifically targets all community demos, with a specific emphasis on the young and other at-risk populations. The benefits gained from this session will provide the greater community with greater insight on this health issue, and foster greater collaboration between the black community and the health care professionals in dealing with HIV/AIDS.
